### COMMUNITY OUTREACH SERVICE DOCTOR'S INFORMATION

### **COS Inclusion Criteria:**

- Patients 18 years and older with mental health conditions
- Patients committed to working with COS clinicians to develop new skills and coping strategies
- Patients who are self-caring
- Patients currently seeing their psychiatrist on a regular basis (minimum 6-8 weeks) for reviews


### **COS Exclusion Criteria:**

- Patients with acute psychosis
- Patients with: severe cognitive impairment/ dementia, prone to wandering and/or an absconding risk
- Patients assessed as a moderate to high risk for: falls. aggression and/or suicide
- Patients already accessing a number of external support services to address their mental health needs.
- OHS issues that may impact on staff safety while visiting patients within the community setting
- Patients who live outside the COS catchment areas

We provide outreach services within a 20-kilometre radius of Delmont Hospital. These areas include:

- Bayside Boroondara Manningham Maroondah Monash
- Glen Eira Knox Stonnington Whitehorse





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## COMMUNITY OUTREACH SERVICE (COS)



'Your Care in Mind'

The Community Outreach Service (COS) consists of highly skilled and dedicated clinicians with extensive experience in mental health and evidence-based therapies. COS clinicians provide planned care and interventions for patients within their community to facilitate their recovery. COS is not an emergency response service.

# The Community Outreach Service assists people:

- Experiencing difficulties making the transition from hospital
- Provides an alternative to inpatient (overnight) care
- Facing challenges coping with their mental illness
- Dealing with family and social relationship issues including isolation
- Managing life transitions and change
- Learning new skills to manage their mental health condition
- Needing support and connecting them into their local community

### Aims:

- Provide a comprehensive assessment of your mental health needs.
- Develop an individual treatment plan which supports your needs and a more independent balanced lifestyle
- Tailored clinical interventions to support your personal growth and recovery
- Work in a collaborative manner with your Delmont treating doctor, liaise with other appropriate health services and family/carers
- Provide a time limited service that provides discharge planning to promote integration back into the community groups and support services

### **Benefits Include:**

- Identifying stressors, signs of relapse and ways to safeguard against them
- Increasing knowledge about mental health conditions; i.e. depression, anxiety
- Learning new skills and constructive ways of coping to promote recovery
- Support with accepting and adapting to change to improve mental health and wellbeing
- Assistance in maintaining and improving overall physical, cognitive, emotional and social functioning
- Provide carer/family education and information as required
- Short/medium interventions provide support to patients and connects them back into the community



### ACCESSING COMMUNITY OUTREACH SERVICE

### **Referral Process:**

A referral from your Delmont Treating Doctor is required. Upon receipt of referral and confirmation of your health fund cover, a member from the Community Outreach Service (COS) will contact you to complete an assessment and discuss your referral in more detail.

### Hours of Operation:

The Community Outreach Service operates Monday to Friday during business hours, excluding public holidays.

### **Catchment Areas:**

The home visits are offered to eligible patients within a 20 km radius of Delmont Hospital. A referral is required to access individual support and monitoring post discharge from hospital.

#### Cost:

Private health insurance may cover the cost of the COS visits. Funding may also be provided by other services such as Work Cover and/or TAC. A fee-paying service is available for those without private health cover.

### **Duration of COS:**

The number of COS visits depends on both the assessment and overall treatment plan for each person and is a time limited service. A review occurs every 6-8 visits with the COS team and the patient's Delmont treating doctor.
